AVONMOUTH CYCLE ROUTE

Whilst at Sustrans Rebecca led on progressing concept designs to the detailed design stage, ready for construction. She used creative drainage and segregation solutions to overcome complex constraints, most notably a flat topography and turning requirements for large vehicles.



QUIETWAYS PROGRAMME

Whilst at Sustrans Rebecca was lead designer for four Quietway cycle routes across London: Woolwich to Lee, CS3 extension, Greenwich to Kent House and Colliers Wood to Sutton. Rebecca has led teams of colleagues producing designs for each route, from concept to consultation to detailed design.



DAGENHAM HEALTHY STREETS

Whilst at Sustrans Rebecca was lead designer on this community-led project, conducting a healthy streets check on a busy high street in east London to inform concept designs. Using the check, Rebecca produced ambitious concept designs to make the street environment safer and more welcoming.



DIY STREETS MARKS GATE

Whilst at Sustrans Rebecca led co-design sessions with local residents and stakeholders to identify key barriers to walking and cycling in Marks Gate, and helped produce concept designs to overcome them. This community-led project was awarded a Local Transport Award in 2018.
